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**The Impact of COVID on Missouri's Children and Organizations Who Serve Them**

**JEFFERSON CITY** — *Missouri KIDS COUNT* has released its 28<sup>th</sup> annual snapshot on the well-being of the state's children including indicators tracking trends in four domains, economic, education, health, and family and community. The current indicators show a snapshot of how our state's children fared in 2019, compared to previous years, serving as a baseline as we begin to understand the catastrophic impact that COVID-19 has had on Missouri's families with children. With the rollout of vaccinations, the optimistic outlook of an end to the pandemic continues to increase. However, the implications could be long lasting for the dozen counties in Missouri with more than 30% of children in poverty in 2019 with the pandemic response triggering a sudden rise in unemployment and employment insecurity that has left many families fearful of how to pay their bills.

State, county, and legislative district indicators can be found online at [missourikidscountdata.org](http://missourikidscountdata.org) or on the Missouri KIDS COUNT mobile app. Indicators are also reported for Missouri's child population by race and ethnicity. While disparities persist for minority children, progress was evident through 2019. However, with widespread economic damage caused by the coronavirus, these gains are threatened. According to the U.S. Census Bureau's Household Pulse Survey, at one point during the pandemic, nearly 55% of Missouri households with children reported losing some employment income and as many as 40% of those households had trouble paying for usual household expenses for at least a portion of 2020. Among adults with young children surveyed by Washington University in St. Louis, one-third said that they are now less likely to return to work due to a lack of childcare.



Tracy Greever-Rice, the Missouri KIDS COUNT Program Director, said "While Missouri has made progress in recent years in addressing child poverty, the pandemic has had a disparate impact on Missouri households with children. Missourians have experienced job and income loss, creating both housing and food insecurity, and leaving families unsure of how to meet day-in/day-out living expenses."

Here are just a few of the impacts on Missouri's families extracted through data collected from the U.S. Census Bureau's Household Pulse Survey:

- Among respondents who had kids in their home, 21% said that they had felt down, depressed or hopeless in the previous week.
- Nationwide, 12% of families with children lack health insurance – a rate that has been worsening over the past four years.
- Also discouraging: 34% of people in households with children reported delaying medical care the month prior.
- A housing catastrophe is looming for communities of color. Nationwide, 31% of Blacks, 26% of Latinos, and 26% of individuals of two or more races and other race reported being on the verge of missing a rent or mortgage payment. By comparison, just 12% of white households shared this same concern.

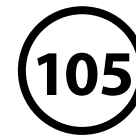

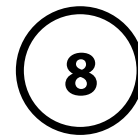
